

The Placement Year is an extended period of work-based professional experience of up to 12 months. During the Placement, you will be undertaking work as an employee of an organisation and will be treated as an employee for the duration of the placement period.

You must be studying on one of the "2-Year MSc with Professional Practice" business programmes. A student must be of good academic standing, which means you have consistently met the standards set by the university, detailed in the Student Charter, Student Discipline and Student Engagement Policies. Students are responsible for finding their own placements but will receive support from The University of Law Business School's Placement Team, Employability Department and from academic advisors throughout the process.

The Placement Year is an opportunity to gain valuable work experience related to your postgraduate study, in an organisation or business. It connects academic theory with business practice and develops essential skills to enhance your future employability prospects. An appropriate Placement should offer you the opportunity to participate in existing projects and/or tasks, to enhance your professional skills and to learn more about a particular sector or job role.

The Placement takes place in the second year of the MSc, with the expectation that it will begin within the month following the end of the taught MSc. It must not interfere with university commitments or contravene any visa limitations. All placements must
